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



Now, shall we play a game?

Now, together we will read the supplication of Amantu and then we will say kalima shahada. And then, our teacher will give us an example from our daily life. The students need to find what they can say in that situation. For example;

- 🔥 ا saw a beautiful flower, I say Subhanallah «سُبْحَانُ اللهِ»
- «اللهُ أَكْبَرُ» When I learn that people were created out of clay, I say Allahu Akbar «اللهُ أَكْبَرُ»
- 👝 To a friend who got good grades in an exam, I say Mashallah «مَا شَاءَ اللهُ»
- «أَسْتَغْفِرُ اللهُ» When you mispronounce a word, you say Astaghfirullah «أَسْتَغْفِرُ اللهُ»
- When you earn or lose a good amount of money, you say Alhamdulillah (الْحَمْدُ لِلهِ)»

 Those who do not say the correct words will be out of the game. And the one who does not make any mistakes will be the winner.

Let's see who will say the correct word in each situation!

If we read Amantu all the time, we will enlighten and polish our hearts. By this way, we will strengthen our faith (iman) and will be more successful.

Then, are you ready to earn the Medal of Faith and to enlighten and polish our heart with the light of faith? So let's start!



There are six stages that need to be passed in order to win the medal of faith.

Here is the 1st one:



1 The Stage of "Believing in Allah"

I believe in Allah and get stronger

Allah is the One Who has created all creatures in the universe. Nothing can exist by itself. For example; an artist is the one who paints the drawings. Cooks are the ones who cook the meals. The houses are built by engineers and constructors. Then, who created us? Of course, Allah the Fxalted...

We cannot get the blessings that we have without spending some effort and money. However, Allah is the One Who makes us to see, to walk, and to feel, He is the One Who gives us our organs without asking anything in return and without making us ask for them.

Allah makes us warm by the Sun, but He doesn't ask any money in return.

Allah makes the Moon a lamp for us in the night, and helps us to find our way by using the stars, but never asks any money in return.

He supplies provisions of various kind of animals but never asks any favor in return.

He creates the herbs for us, feeds and heals us but never asks for favor in return.

Our Lord gives many more things to us without expecting any favor in return.

Trying to understand Allah by thinking these things is called "Tafakkur." We can understand how much great and powerful Allah is, when look at the blessings He gave us. We say "Allahu akbar (Allah is the Greatest)" to express how much

we are fascinated. We become grateful for the things He gave us as gifts and say "Alhamdulillah (Praise to Allah)." And we start everything we are going to do by remembering his name in other words by saying "Bismillahirrahmanirrahim." Thinking about what Allah has created, and seeing the beauty in them strengthen our Iman (faith). By this way, we accept the existence and oneness of Allah without any doubt. Believing in Allah makes us stronger and helps us to overcome difficulties. Therefore, the most important and the greatest part of our medal is "Believing in Allah".

The Game Of Tafakkur

The Sun, the Moon, water, soil, flowers, vegetables, fruits, animals (like horses, donkeys); animals the meat of which is allowed to be eaten (such as sheep, goat, cow); eye, ear and other blessings that Allah created for us. Each student choose one of them and says the name he/she chose loudly. Then all students say together, "Allah has given us a task. We work without stopping. Come on then let's say La ilaha illallah, bismillah. Tawakkaltu alallah." Then they all start going around in circle. Then, the teacher chooses one of the students secretly and he/she leaves the circle secretly and hides in a place. When they are asked to stop, they stop and try to find out which one of their friends is absent. For example, let's assume our friend who chose to be the Sun is absent. They talk about what would happen in the absence of the Sun. Questions like "Can you imagine a world without the Sun?" "What would happen if Allah did not make the Sun rise and set for us?" are asked.

After a conversation about tafakkur, they all say: "Alhamdulillah, Allah created the Sun for us. Thank to You, o our Lord. Many thanks to You O Allah!" Then, the friend who was the Sun joins the group again, and they start circling by saying: "Allah has given us a task. We work without stopping, now. La ilaha illallah.



I Wonder How Allah Is

Do you want to know Allah more closely Who has those beautiful names? People asked our Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) too about Allah. How big was He? Did He have any kids? Who was His father? They asked and asked... In fact, they did not ask out of curiosity, but to make fun of Islam and our Prophet. Then, Allah revealed chapter al-Ikhlas. Allah described Himself in four short sentences. He taught us how speak less but say many things.

The meaning of chapter al-Ikhlas: "Say, 'He is Allah, (who is) One, Allah, The Self-Sufficient Master, Whom all creatures need, He neither eats nor drinks. He begets not, nor was He begotten and there is none co-equal or comparable unto Him."

Are you ready to tell the attributes of Allah quickly that we learned from the Qur'an and Hadith?

Our Allah, with His Great Attributes:

Allah has the Attribute of "Wujud (Existence)": He is eternal and everlasting.

Allah has the Attribute of "Al-Qidam (pre-Eternity)": Allah exists without a beginning and an ending.

Allah has the Attribute of "Al-Baqa' (Everlastingness)": Allah's existence does not end. He is everlasting.

Allah has the Attribute of "Al-Wahdaniyyah (Oneness)": Allah is one. There is nothing like Him. He created us differently and we are same as human beings. He shows that He is One, by creating everything differently.

Allah has the Attribute of "Al-Qiyamu bin-Nafs (Non-neediness of others): Allah does not need a father and a mother to come to existence because He exists without a beginning and because He neither begets nor was He begotten.

Allah has the Attribute of "Al-Mukhalafatu lil-hawadith (Non-Resemblance to the Creation)": Allah neither does not resemble a mountain, or a camel, or the Sun. He will show Himself in Paradise to those who will be successful in the test of this world.

Allah has the Attribute of "Al-Hayah (Life)": Allah is alive, and those who believe in Him are full of life.



Allah has the Attribute of "Al-'Ilm (Knowledge): There is nothing that Allah do-esn't know.

Allah has the Attribute of "Al-Sami' (Hearing)": Allah can hear the lowest voices, even He knows what we have inside but we don't tell.

Allah has the Attribute of "Al-Basar (Sight)": Allah sees even a black ant in the dark and nothing can be done without He sees.

Allah has the Attribute of "Al-'Iradah (Will)": Allah creates everything from nothing in the moment He wants. He does not need to get ready before creating. He creates everything perfectly whenever He wants.

Allah has the Attribute of "Al-Qudrah (Power)": Allah makes the planets to move. He creates perfectly even a small mosquito. He has the power to do anything, and there is nothing beyond His power. He creates everything He wants. He is the One who creates both lions and warms as He wants.

Allah has the Attribute of "Al-Kalam (Speech)": Allah speaks. He speaks through his verses in the Qur'an. When we pray Allah and when we perform our daily prayers, it means that we are speaking to Him. Our Lord answers us through His verses in the Qur'an.





How Great and Perfect Our Lord is!

It is impossible for someone to fail when he believes in Him and does what He asks us to do!

Those who believe and trust in Allah wins all the time.

Ayat Al-Kursi) (The Verse Of Throne)

Ayat al-Kursi tells us about Allah like chapter al-Ikhlas. We understand how great and powerful our Lord is when we read this verse. Our Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) said about this verse: "Everything has its pinnacle and the pinnacle of the Qur'an is chapter al-Bagarah. In it there is a verse which is the greatest in the Qur'an: Ayat al-Kursi." (Tirmidhi)

2 Stage Of "Believing In Angels"

Angels are the creatures which are created from nur (light), and they are creatures like lights. We cannot see them with our eyes, but Prophets saw them.


Angels are very powerful. They do whatever Allah asks them to do, and never disobey Him. They do not have male and female genders like human beings. In other words, they are quite different than us.

Angels whisper the good and beautiful thoughts to our hearts. They also pray for us and say "Amin" following our invocations and when we perform our daily prayers. There are angels visiting people who always remember Allah and read the Qur'an. They bring Allah's mercy to us. Our hearts are filled with peace and tranquility when they come near us. There are even some angels who are responsible for holding the earth and the sky in their place. There are also some angels protecting us and stay with us all the time.





Some Angels



The Duty of the Angels of Kiraman Katibin: They are on our right and left shoulder and record our good and bad deeds.

(Students stand up and show their shoulders and act like writing something down)

The Duty of the Angels of Munkar and Nakir: is to Ask questions in the grave.

(Students stand up and make the motion of 'be careful')

The Duty of the Angels of Ridwan is in Paradise,

(Students raise their hands and stand up)

The Duty of the Angels of Malik is in Hell,

(Students raise their hands and stand up)

Being the Head Angel! Being the Head Angel!

(Students all stand up and say it together)

The Duty of the Angels of Hafaza is: to Protect people

(Students all stand up and hold their arms)

The Duty of the Angels of Hamalat al-Arsh: is to Hold the earth and the sky in their place.

(Students act like they are carrying something on their back)





Gabriel is the angel of revelation. He brings the information and the news which he took from Allah to prophets. He is a kind of a messenger between Allah and the prophets.

Our Lord says in chapter al-Baqara verse 97 about Angel Gabriel;

"Say, 'Whoever is an enemy to Gabriel - it is (none but) he who has brought the Qur'an down upon your heart, (O Muhammad), by permission of Allah, confirming that which was before it and as guidance and good tidings for the believers."



Angel Michael is responsible for organizing the events taking place in nature. He arranges the natural events like seasons, plants, and blooms of trees on their time without making any mistakes.

Our Lord talks about Angel Michael in the 98th verse of chapter al-Baqarah.

"Whoever is an enemy to Allah and His angels and His messengers and Gabriel and Michael- then indeed, Allah is an enemy to the disbelievers."

Angel Israfil

Angel *Israfil* is going to blow the "Sur" (trumpet) at the end of the world. "Sur" literally means horn. When he blows the trumpet, the Day of Resurrection will happen and the life of *akhirah*, (the Hereafter) will start. All people will be resurrected and will be gathered in the place of *mahshar*. Our Lord tells us about this event in 68th verse of chapter al-Zumar:

"And the Horn will be blown, and whoever is in the heavens and whoever is on the earth will fall dead except whom Allah wills. Then it will be blown again, and at once they will be standing, looking on."



Angel Of Death: Azrail

He is the angel who takes people whose lifetime in this world is over to Allah. The lives given us by Allah will be taken by the Angel of Death. Good people feel so happy when they see the angel of death and feel amazed because of his beauty. However, bad people get scared, because they realize that it is time for the punishment for what they have done. Our Lord says in 61st verse of chapter al-An'am:

"And He is the subjugator over His servants, and He sends over you guardian-angels until, when death comes to one of you, Our messengers take him, and they do not fail (in their duties)."



He immediately gave the kid's property and the money back. Everyone who saw them felt shocked. Abu Jahil's Friends said.


- We were going to make fun of Muhammed. Why did you give kid's money back?


Allah protects the believers from all kind of evil as our Lord said in the 30th verse of chapter Fussilat,



The last holy book revealed to us by Allah is the Holy Qur'an. All other holy books except the Holy Qur'an sent by our Lord are either lost or corrupted. Only the Qur'an reached this day without any changes. It will never change until the earth exists. Our Lord informs us about this fact in chapter al-An'am verse 115,

"And the word of your Lord has been fulfilled in truth and in justice. None can alter His words, and He is the Hearing, the Knowing."

The Englightening Book

Allah sent the Holy Qur'an to our Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him). When we read the Qur'an our mind and heart are enlightened and we learn the secrets of becoming a real hero. Do you know how?

We know more about our Lord through the Qur'an:

We understand the Qur'an more when we read the Qur'an. In the Qur'an, our Lord describes himself to us. He tells us how He created the universe, the angels and their duties. Allah's light embraces us as much as we understand the Qur'an. Our face and eyes are enlightened.

There are miraculous verses in the **Qur'an**:

These verses give us information about many things ranging from heavenly bodies to our cells which we cannot see with our eyes and this information makes us to think deeply. In the time that the Qur'an was revealed, people thought that the earth was in the shape of a plate. However, the Qur'an gave us information implying that the earth is in oval shape, and turns around the Sun. The Qur'an saved people from misinforma-



tion and enlightened them throughout the ages. If we accept the Qur'an as a guidance book, we will improve a lot in serving people and doing useful things and nobody can do better than us. If we work and do our duties properly and in a good way, just as Allah wants us to do, we will be a person and a society to whom all people admire.

The Qur'an makes us stronger with acts of worship:

The Qur'an teaches us how to worship. Our body and soul get stronger through these acts of worship. We are asked to perform daily prayers, give obligatory alms (zakah), and perform pilgrimage (hajj). By performing these acts of worship, we will be a person with good morals and will be loved by everyone.

We learn the parables and duas (invocations)

of the Prophets from the Qur'an:

Many difficulties that the Prophets experienced in their lives are told us in the Qur'an. The way how they overcame those difficulties are also taught us in the Qur'an. If we read the Qur'an much, we learn how to overcome if we face such difficulties. Moreover, we learn the ways of being a Muslim with good morality by reading the prophets' life stories.



The Qur'an teaches us how to be healthy:

There are therapeutic verses in the Qur'an. There is also information about living a healthy life. Even, we can give up our bad habits by reading the therapeutic verses found in the Qur'an.

The Qur'an is a cure for us with all aspects. It is said in 82nd verse of chapter al-'Isra: "And We send down of the Qur'an that which is healing and mercy for the believers, but it does not increase the wrongdoers except in loss."

The Qur'an makes us a person with good morals:

We learn the good and correct behaviors from the Qur'an. Allah prohibited some behaviors to prevent us from doing bad things and get hurt. For example, Allah warns us by saying, "Don't ever be from among those who falsify, and oppresses." If we follow the words of Allah in the Qur'an, we will be well-behaved people. We will be loved and respected by people around us. If we do what Allah asks us to do and live



our life according to these rules, we will be a hero who is loved by everyone.


How we play it?

Our holy book the Qur'an is like a treasure consisting various kinds of valuable information. If we love our book and read it regularly every day, we start learning very valuable information and realities from this treasure.

Like our Prophet did...

When the unbelievers asked questions about the events that had happened in the very old times, our Prophet Muhammad would immediately answer them by reading verses. Everyone would feel shocked and ask him, "Where did you learn this? You were not in this world at the time!" Our Prophet would explain the truths with the knowledge he got from the Qur'an. Thus, the unbelievers who did not believe in the fact that he was a Prophet would feel shocked.

Our Prophet was taught about how sick people could be healed by some verses of the Qur'an. He was taught that honey and ginger could be used to make our body stronger. Our Prophet also told us how we could be protected from evil beings and badness by reading chapters of al-Falaq and al-Nas. 

Stage Of "Believing In Prophets"

From among people, Allah chose His messengers who taught the holy books to people and become examples to them by their acts and behaviors. He gave them "the Seal of Prophethood." Abilities and characters of the prophets are different than each other. However, they all love Allah so much, and are heroes who obey what Allah commands word by word.

The Conditions to Have "the Seal of Prophethood"

It is necessary to have some superior characteristics in order to be a prophet. Allah chose His messengers from among the people who had these characteristics, and helped them all the time.

- 1. Sidq (Loyalty): Sidq means honesty. The prophets were extremely truthful and honest people. They never lied. When they said that something had happened, it happened for sure. They spoke in the light of the revelation Allah sent to them.
- 2 Amanah (Trustworthiness): It means being trustworthy. The prophets were people whose words and deeds could be completely trusted. When they were entrusted with something, they protected it in the best way and returned it back to its owner.
- **3.** Fatanah (Intelligence): It means being clever and smart. The prophets were very clever and highly intellectual people. That's why they could not be deceived. They knew the best and the truest of everything.
- 4. Ismah (Innocence): It means not to commit sins. The prophets do not commit any sin openly or secretly. They did not do evil or bad deeds, hurt anybody's feelings. They always did good and right deeds.
- 5. Tabligh (Delivering a message): It means delivering a message. The prophets conveyed all religious messages that they got from Allah without making any change. They were also the ones who could explain in the best way the message that they delivered.
- 6. Amn al-azl: It means that they could not be removed from their duty. They would never be dismissed from the mission of prophethood. They were and will be the prophets all the time in this world and Hereafter.
- **7.** Courage: It means being brave. The prophets were all brave people. They never felt afraid of their enemies or unbelievers, and they did not stay away from struggling
- 8. Iffah (Chastity): It means being chaste and pure. All prophets were modest and honorable people. They never were in a shameful or embarrassing situation.
- **9.** Adalah (Justice): It means acting with justice. All prophets were just people and never oppressed or acted with injustice. They solved contradictions between people and made the suitable decision.

Arrival Of The Prophets

Our Lord sent the Prophet Adam as the first human being and the first prophet. Afterwards, many prophets were sent periodically. Finally, our Prophet Muhammad Mustafa (peace be upon him) was sent. After the Prophet Muhammad, there will be no prophet sent to this world.

So, prophets, whose names are mentioned in the Qur'an, became the guides and perfect examples to people in goodness and truth. Allah sent them to humanity as examples. Some nations and people denied the prophets, and treated them badly. However, Allah continued sending the prophets and revelation to help them find the right path and be good people.



Some Prophets Mentioned In The Qur'an And Their Secrets

If we read the Qur'an carefully, we understand some secrets of each prophet which brought them to success and endless happiness.

Like the Prophet Joseph: The Brothers of Joseph felt jealous of him and th-

rew him into a well. The Prophet Joseph never said "Why this is happening to me, I am an unlucky person." He believed for sure that Allah would help him. He patiently waited and prayed in the well. Finally, he got out from well and was sold as a slave. However, he never felt sad for being sold as a slave. After waiting patiently, he was appointed as the minister responsible from treasury in Egypt.



The situation of the Prophet Joseph tells us, "Dear Kids! Do not ever feel depressed. Pray to Allah, and wait patiently. Surely, Allah's help will arrive to you."

Like the Prophet Suleiman: He learned the languages of all animals and plants. He showed us that it is possible to speak to them and they have their own languages. Nowadays, scientists have found out that some plants have a special language between themselves. The Prophet Suleiman taught us long time ago that we have to value every creature created by Allah. When we care all creatures, trees will not be destroyed, animals will not go extinct, and seas will not be



polluted. All these creatures carry us, help us and serve us. The Prophet Suleiman showed us how to care to the creatures around us and how we will benefit from their services.

The Prophet Suleiman was a commander who cared not to disturb even ants when he was passing by with his army. Once he even smiled at an ant and made the following invocation:

"...My Lord, enable me to be grateful for Your favor which You have bestowed upon me and upon my parents and to do righteous of which You approve. And admit me by Your mercy into (the ranks of) Your righteous servants."

(Chapter al-Naml verse 19)

Like the Prophet Aaron: The Prophet Aaron was the brother and assistant of the Prophet Moses. He always supported his brother. They depended on each other. Together they taught the truth and the good to people. They also defeated Pharaoh the powerful ruler of their era.

He influenced the people by his good voice and speech. Everyone was amazed of his speeches. His brother, Moses was lisper and people could not understand

his speeches very well. However, the Prophet Aaron did not tell that "I speak better than Moses, so I am a better Prophet." He knew that the most important thing was delivering the people the message and news informed him by Allah. The prophets Moses and Aaron believed that if they support each other, they will achieve great happiness and success.



He never felt jealous and said, "Why the

holy book which Allah revealed to my brother Moses was not sent to me?!" Instead, he said, "Whatever Allah gives to anyone is beautiful" and supported his brother the Prophet Moses all the time. He showed us that all powerful enemies can be defeated if they stand together against them. These two brothers became the prophets that Allah sent His greetings.

Chapter Al-Inshirah

The Prophets passed through very rough times. They came across with people who did not listen to them, even insulted them. Unbelievers in Mecca also treated our Prophet badly. They denied him and even slandered him. Our Prophet felt so hurt and sad, but he never gave up telling them about Allah. Our Lord tells in chapter al-Inshirah about how He helped our Prophet in those hard times and how He relieved his heart. He informs us that there is easiness together with every hardship and we can overcome them if we become patient. Allah advises us not to waste our time with useless things, and start a new duty whenever we are done what we do. In this way, we can be happier and more successful. If we want to be a hero like our Prophet, we should read chapter al-Inshirah as well. We should understand the meaning of this chapter. In order to be happy, we should work hard, and never forget that Allah is our helper all the time.



5 Stage of "Believing in Hereafter"

"And who believe in what has been revealed to you, (O Muhammad), and what was revealed before you, and of the Hereafter they are certain (in faith)."

(Chapter al-Bagarah, 4)

Time which will start with resurrection and will last forever is called as "the Hereafter." Believing in resurrection after all people die, and rewards and punishment in Hereafter is one of the necessities of being a Muslim.

Our Lord created the Earth for us. He gave a lifetime to every person he created. This lifetime is given to them to show whether they are good or bad. When all people's lifetimes end, the duty of this world will also end. Our Lord will destroy this world which He created from nothing at the end of this world. When that day comes, Angel Israfil will blow Sur and the world will be completely destroyed. When Angel Israfil blows Sur for a second time, all people will be resurrected.

All people will see the result of their good and bad deeds. Those whose rights were violated will get their rights from people. People who oppressed and hurt others will give their good deeds to these people. Oppressed people will get all their rights. Judgment Day is the day when the right and the wrong, the good and the bad will be distinguished. Those who do good deeds will be rewarded and get their gifts, and go to the Paradise. Those who do bad things will stay in Hell to get their punishment and will be devoid of the blessings of the Paradise.

This is told us by our Prophet,

"Whoever has oppressed another person concerning his reputation or anything else, he should beg him to forgive him before the Day of Resurrection when there will be no money (to compensate for wrong deeds), but if he has good deeds, those good deeds will be taken from him according to his oppression which he has done, and if he has no good deeds, the sins of the oppressed person will be loaded to him." (Bukhari, Mazalim, 10)



Do You Know?

Our Lord will not ask about the deeds of other creatures in the world. He will ask only the peoples' deeds. Because our Lord valued people and gave them responsibilities. Each one will be asked according to their responsibilities and intelligence. For example, responsibility of doctors is helping the patients to heal. The teachers' responsibility is to give good education to the students. Doctors will not be asked for the responsibility of doctors.

Because of this, the one who believes in the Hereafter acts very carefully. He knows that he will be asked of everything he does in this world. He does not treat anybody with injustice and works to do good all the time. A Muslim, who fulfills this condition, achieves another necessary quality to become a hero.

Curiosity Of The Prophet Ibrahim

The Prophet Ibrahim was wondering how resurrection after death will happen. One day, he asked Allah, "O my Lord! Can you show me how you resurrect dead people?" And Allah said, "don't You believe in Me?" And the Prophet Ibrahim said, "I believe in You, O my Lord, but I wonder how it will happen. And I want to see to understand better." Thereupon Allah said:

"Take four birds, then cause them to incline towards you (then slaughter them, cut them into pieces), and then put a portion of them on every hill, and call them, they will come to you in haste. And know that Allah is All-Mighty, All-Wise." (Chapter al-Baqara 2: 260)

Thereupon, the Prophet Adam took four birds. He raised them and as Allah commanded. After they died, he took their pieces (wings, legs, heads) and left them on different mountains. Then, he called them. Allah collected the pieces of birds and they came to him flying. The Prophet Ibrahim was amazed. At that moment, he clearly understood how Allah creates and resurrects. So like this, we are born in this world, grow up and live. We will depart when

our time comes. Our body will turn into dust in

our graves. Then, Allah will resurrect us in

the Hereafter and we will be gathe-

red again. We will go to our Prophet

Muhammed joyfully like birds. Those who love our Prophet and live like him will run to him happily and gather around him. Because those who really love each other will never be separated, and will be together forever. How nice!

We know that every action we do is like flower seeds, and will bloom into various and colorful flowers in the Hereafter.

Plants tell us: Many flowers blossom in the spring, and plants turn to green. Everywhere becomes colorful and fragrance of flowers covers all over the places. After a while, season changes and the flowers start turning to yellow, fade, and fall. When we examine them, we see that all plants die. After that, the only thing that remains is dry soil. After a while, time passes and spring comes again. Some of the dried plants, which turned into dust, start blooming into new plants again. 



The Cameras Are Recording

There are cameras continuously recording how we behave, and what we say on the path of destiny written by Allah. Allah makes the angels of kiraman katibin fulfill this duty. These angels continuously record our good and bad behaviors as they are. The tapes recorded by these cameras will be presented in front of everyone without anything missing or added to them. On that day, whatever we said and did will appear before us.

Our Prophet says,

"The feet of Allah's slave shall not move on the Day of Judgment until he is asked about four things:

- about his life and what he did with it,
- about his knowledge and what he did with it,
- about his wealth and how he earned it and where he spent it on,
- about his body and for what he wore it out." (Tirmidhi, Qiyamah, 1)



Our Lord will ask us about whether we have spent our life with good, correct and beneficial things. Everything we did will be reflected on a type of screen. Even the things which are done secretly without seen by anyone will be clearly revealed. If we spend our time with good and helpful things, our points for Paradise, in other words our good deeds will increase. If we sleep more than we need, or play games all the time and waste our time, our good deeds will be less. In fact, we need so much good deeds to be able to enter Paradise.



In fact, our body created by Allah is entrusted to us by Him. Our Lord gave our body to us to use it comfortably in doing good deeds. If we do not care our bodies by eating more than we need, or eating less than we need, or not brushing our teeth, or not cleaning our nails and hair; we will be among those who could not protect this body entrusted us by Allah. We will lose our Paradise points, rewards. However, if we care our bodies perfectly, and perform prayers by our bodies, gain knowledge, and do beneficial things, we will get so many Paradise points. However, if we lie with our tongue, take others' stuff without their permission with our hands, and go wrong places with our feet, we will be away from Paradise. May Allah protect us from doing such things! Whereas, Allah has given this body to us to earn Paradise with it.

In addition to this, we will be asked about where we have earned and spent our money. Have we steal someone else's money or have we earned it by our own efforts? If we earned it by stealing other people's rights, our Paradise points will immediately be given to the person whose right was stolen. If we earned it by our own efforts, our points will increase. Then, it will be checked if we have spent our wealth in good or bad ways. If we have spent it for good causes without wasting it, and shared them with the needy people, we will be really rich in the Hereafter. Countless gifts, foods and drinks will be ours in the Paradise. How beautiful! However, those who waste, become stingy and never share anything with others will miss these beautiful things... How bad...

Chapter Al-Zalzalah



Acts of worship are our shields to protect our heroism that we have achieved. Yes, by performing the acts of worship, we develop a kind of shield around us which protects us from all kinds of evil. By this way, we get stronger.

Do you know how? For this, you have to pass through 5 stages. Every stage will make you stronger and protect you from harmful factors and dangers.

Now it is time to raise or put on our shield.





I declare that I am a Muslim with my shield of *Kalima Shahada*. When we say *Kalima Shahada*, our first shield embraces us.

A person who says Kalima Shahada becomes "a Muslim".



A person who says kalima shahada separates himself from everything that is wrong and bad. In this way, a Muslim says that he certainly believes in the existence of Allah, Owner of everything.

Moreover, one who says kalima shahada also states that Muhammad (peace be upon him) is our Prophet and he is also a servant of Allah just like we are. By saying this statement, one emphasizes that he tries to live just as our Prophet taught us, to do good and beautiful things, and to treat everyone with justice.

How beautiful it is to be a person who loves Allah and trusts in Him and is protected by Allah. Let's all say Kalima Shahada together.

"Ashahadu an la ilaha illallah wa ashhadu anna Muhammadan abduhu Wa Rasuluhu."

It means, I bear witness that (there is) no god except Allah; He is One. He has no partner, and I bear witness that Muhammad is His Servant and Messenger.



Umar's Kalima Shahada

Everyone was feeling afraid of Umar ibn Khattab before he embraced Islam. Because he was very strong and used to beat and harm others when he was angry. He felt so angry when he heard that our Prophet left their ancestors' religion and brought a new religion. Without hesitation, he decided to kill our Prophet. When his friends saw him in rage, they said: "You should first check your sister! She changed her religion as well and became a Muslim." When he heard this, Umar ibn Khattab changed his direction to his sister's



home. When he arrived there, he heard his sister and her husband loudly reading the Qur'an. When Umar heard the Qur'an, he said "how beautiful it is" and started listening to it. He was influenced from the Qur'an and amazed from what he heard. However, while he was listening to the Qur'an, he was enraged again and said, "One cannot oppose our ancestors' religion and I cannot let them follow this new religion" and entered their home in rage. He was angry with his sister and sister's husband. He shouted at them and even slapped them.

They both said,

- "This is the book of the religion we believe in. You can have a look and read it if you want." After reading the Qur'an, Umar realized that it was quite different and beautiful book. He immediately set off to visit our Prophet. Muslims who saw his arrival felt so afraid. They discussed and said: "Oh no! What if Umar try to attempt to hurt our Prophet?! Should we not let him enter the Prophet's presence?" At that moment, our Prophet let Umar to come to him.

Umar kneeled down directly when he came to our Prophet and said, "Tell me about the Qur'an." Because he

was amazed by the verses of the Qur'an so much that he deeply wanted to listen them again and again. Umar said, "This is such a beautiful book! It cannot be written by a human being! This is a book

from Allah." He wanted to become a Muslim at that moment. Then, our Prophet taught him Kalima Shahada.

And Umar converted to Islam by saying "Ashahadu an la ilaha illallah wa ash-hadu anna Muhammadan abduhu Wa Rasuluhu." After that day, everything

started to change. by reading the Qur'an and listening to our Prophet, in time Umar understood that it was wrong to act in anger. He started to pray, fast, and give alms and charity. Every passing day, these acts of worship made him a better Muslim. Whenever a bad thought came to his mind, he was able to clear them out of his mind fast. Bad people were not able to approach him. *Kalima* Shahada that he said all the time and his worships protected him like a shield.

After learning *Kalima* Shahada and becoming a Muslim, angry Umar was gone, and a lovely, understanding and helpful Umar came in his place. Everyone started to love him.

Umar became a caliph after the Prophet Muhammad passed away. He ruled people with justice in the light of what he learned from the Qur'an and from our Prophet. During his ruling, almost no one committed a crime. Everyone started to follow him with great love and admiration.

Only ill-minded and evil people continued being afraid of Umar and trembling in his presence.





I Am Strengthening My Iman (Faith)

Students go in a garden with their teacher where they can find tree branches. Everyone starts looking for small branches. Those who find a branch says Kalima Shahada and come to the teacher.

After everyone finds a branch and brings it to the teacher, he holds one of the branches in his hand and says, "Now all of us have faith, but it is a bit weak I think. Can it be broken easily?"

"So let's do something to strengthen our faith."

When it is said "prayer (Salat)," students run to the right; when it is said "Fasting (Sawm)" students run to the left; when it is said "Alms (Zakat)," students run forward; when it is said "Pilgrimage (Hajj)", the students run behind; and when it is said "Good morality," students run to any direction they choose.

Those who find a branch say Kalima Shahada and put it to next to the previous branch.

When they are done collecting tree branches, the teacher asks: "Now hold all of the branches you collected. Try to break them all at once. Can you break them? No, you can't, can you?"

Then teacher continues, "Our faith exists

with Kalima Shahada, and becomes stronger with worships and good morality like these branches. It becomes so much stronger with other branches that no one and nothing can break them. Devil and evil people cannot harm our faith, either.

We congratulate you all. Now you have strong faith and you learned how to protect it in the best way.





Supplication

This supplication narrates the event when Allah ascended our Prophet up to high heavens (Mi'raj) in the Night of night travel (Isra). This event happened during the days that polytheists were oppressing and hurting our Prophet so much.

When our Prophet was ascended to heavens (Mi'raj), the angels and other prophets greeted our Prophet. They welcomed him with love.

Our Prophet felt so excited and amazed when he was raised to the presence of Allah and said,

التَّحِيَّاتُ لِلهِ، الزَّاكِيَاتُ لِلهِ، الطَّيِبَاتُ الصَّلَوَاتُ لِلهِ

"All good invocations, ali prayers, all good things, and all praises are for Allah." Our Lord greeted our Prophet by saying:

اَلسَّلاَمُ عَلَيْكَ اَيُّهَا النَّبِيُّ وَرَحْمَةُ اللَّهِ وَبَرَكَاتُهُ

PROPERTY.

"O Prophet! Peace, Allah's mercy, and His blessings be upon you." Our Prophet did not forget his *ummah* (followers) at that emotional moment and said immediately,


السَّلاَمُ عَلَيْنَا وَعَلَى عِبَادِ اللَّهِ الصَّالِحِينَ

All Muslims gained strength against the tortures of the polytheists by this event. They attached to each other and said *Kalima* Shahada much stronger. After this event, they did not give up saying *Kalima* Shahada no matter what happened to them. As always, Muslims became victorious in the end.

The Tree Of Kalima Shahada



Our Lord tells us about the tree of *Kalima* Shahada in the Qur'an;

"Have you not considered how Allah presents an example, (making) a good word like a good tree, whose root is firmly fixed and its branches (high) in the sky? It produces its fruit all the time by permission of its Lord. And Allah presents examples for the people that perhaps they will be reminded. And the example of a bad word is like a bad tree, uprooted from the surface of the earth, not having any stability."

(Chapter Ibrahim, 14: 24-26)

When we say *Kalima* Shahada, we plant a tree whose branches reach up in the sky. The trunk of our tree becomes stronger when we perform our daily prayers. When we fast, give alms, and perform pilgrimage, the strong branches of our tree stretch towards the sky. By means of our good





Allah says, "And enjoin prayer upon your family and be steadfast therein. We ask you not for provision; We provide for you, and the (best) outcome is for (those of) righteousness." (Chapter Taha, 20:132)

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Our Prophet said,

"Do not associate anything with Allah, even if you are cut into pieces and burned. Do not neglect any prescribed prayer deliberately, for whoever neglects it deliberately no longer has the protection of Allah." (Ibn Majah, Fitan, 23)





Yes, Salat Is Protecting Us...

We wake before sunrise and perform Salat al-Fajr (the Dawn Prayer) to make our Lord pleased with us. We will full of good energy by breathing the clean air at dawn. By this way, we can think very fast and easily find the truths. We can easily do our homework and duties, and do not get easily tired when we play.

When we are in the middle of the day, we perform *Salat al-Dhuhr* (the Noon Prayer) to get closer to Allah. When we feel tired because of hot weather, hard work and our classes, we perform wudu (ablution), then go to prayer, and feel relaxed. After the prayer, we can happily continue our classes and duties.

We pray Salat al-Asr (the Late Afternoon Prayer) before sunset to express our thankfulness to Allah. Our tiredness goes away and we feel full of peace. Allah increases His help to us and gives us strength to finish our jobs with patience and in a good way. By this way, we can play games with our friends away from bad words and behaviors.

At the sunset, we pray Salat al-Maghrib (the Evening Prayer) to earn contentedness of Allah. Our heart get filled with peace and tranquility and we feel strength to do our duties and help our mother and father at home.

(5) We pray Salat al-'Isha (the Night Prayer) when sleeping time comes. Darkness of night is illuminated by the light of prayer. We think about what we did during the day and thank Allah for our good behaviors and for the blessings He gave us. In addition to this, if we pray Salat al-'Isha and then go to sleep while we are in the state of wudu, it is like we perform prayers until the next morning. Our good deeds continue to increase even when we sleep. By this way, we can easily wake up for Salat al-Fajr next morning.

Do you know? Salat is an act of worship that we perform by both our body and heart. When we pray, we not only turn our heart to Allah but also do the physical exercises that we need to do every day. Salat on the one hand strengthens our heart and on the other hand strengthens the muscles of our neck, waist, arm and leg. There are so many benefits of performing salat, aren't there?

Here Is the Map of the Shield of Salat (Prayer)

With this map, you can learn the times and the number of *rakats* (cycles) of prayer easily. Every time, the shield of *salat* will embrace you and strengthen you more. The shield of prayer will protect us from all kinds of badness. Our Prophet said when he was speaking with his friends,

"If there were a river at the door of anyone of you and he took a bath in it five times a day would you notice any dirt on him?"


The companions said,

"No trace of dirt would be left." The Prophet added,

"That is the example of the five prayers with which Allah blots out (annuls) evil deeds." (Bukhari, Mawakit, 3)

How beautiful it is! The shield of *salat* keeps us away from badness and at the same time cleans us from dirt and strengthens us!





How to perform a three-cycle prayer

If you follow this table carefully, you can perform your ritual prayers in a correct way. By this way, your protecting shield perfectly covers you. Don't forget, each prayer cleans you, prevents you from doing mistakes and bad things. Let us start! May Allah accept your prayers.

1st Cycle

We express our intention to pray. Then we say "Allahu Akbar"



We recite supplication of Subhanaka, then recite istiâdha, chapter al-Fatiha some more verses from the Qur'an. [According to Maliki School, only chapter al-Fatiha some more verses from the Qur'an are recited.] [According to Shafii School, the suplication of wajjahtu is recited in stead of subhanaka.]

Then we bow down and say "Subhana rabbiyal azim" at least three times.

Then we rise back by saying "Sami 'Allahu liman hamidah" and then we say "Allahumma Rabbana laka'lhamd".

We then prostrate and say "Subhana rabbiy al-a'ala" at least three times and and then we rise back from prostration and sit for a while and again prostrate and say "Subhana rabbiy al-a'ala" at least three times [According to Maliki School, we say "Rabbi zalamtu nafsi wa amiltu su'an faghfir li" during prostration]

2nd Cycle

We say basmalah and recite chapter al-Fatiha and then some more verses from the Qur'an. [According to Maliki School, only chapter al-Fatiha some more verses from the Qur'an are recited.]



Then we bow down and say "Subhana rabbiyal azim" at least three times. [According to Maliki School, we say "Subhan a rabbiyal azim" as many times as we want.] Then we rise back by saying "Sami 'Allahu liman hamidah" and then we say "Allahumma Rabbana laka'lhamd".

We then prostrate and say "Subhana rabbiy ala'a'ala" at least three times and then we rise back from prostration and sit for a while and again prostrate and say "Subhana rabbiy al-a'ala" at least three times [According to Maliki School, we say "Rabbi zalamtu nafsi wa amiltu su'an faghfir li" during prostration as many times as we want]

We then sit down and recite the supplications of Tahiyyat, Salli and Barik and Rabbana atina. And finally, we turn our face to right and say "As salamu alaikum wa rahmatullah" and then to left and say the same statement and finish the performance of prayer.

1st Cycle

Perform like the first cycle of 'a two-cycle Prayer'



2nd Cycle

Perform like the second cycle of a two-cycle Prayer.' Recite only the supplication of Tahiyyat when you sit but do not turn your face to right or left in the end. Remember, there is one more cycle we need to pray [According to Shafii School, we say "Allahumma salli ala muhammad" after the recitation of supplication of Tahiyyat]



3rd Cycle

We say basmala and recte chapter al-Fatiha. [According to Maliki School, only chapter al-Fatiha is recited.]

Then we bow down and say "Subhana rabbiyal azim" at least three times. [According to Maliki School, we say "Subhan a rabbiyal azim" as many times as we want.] Then we rise back by saying "Sami 'Allahu liman hamidah" and then we say "Allahumma Rabbana laka'lhamd".

We then prostrate and say "Subhana rabbiy ala'ala' at least three times and then we rise back from prostration and sit for a while and again prostrate and say "Subhana rabbiy al-a'ala" at least three times [According to Maliki School, we

We then sit down and recite the supplications of Tahiyyat. Salli and Barik and Rabbana atina. And finally, we turn our face to right and say "As salamu alaikum wa rahmatullah" and then to left and say the same statement.

bbi zalamtu nafsi wa amiltu su'an faghfir li"

1st Cycle

Perform the first cycle like the first cycle of 'a three-cycle prayer'.

2nd Cycle

Perform the second cycle like the second cycle of 'a three cycle prayer'.



3rd Cycle

Perform the third cycle like the third cycle of 'a third-cycle prayer.' Do not read any other verses from the Qur'an after *Al-Fatiha*.

4th Cycle

O my friend! Continue performing it like the previous cycle. After prostrations, you can sit down and finish your prayer. Recite the supplications of *Tahiyyat*, *Salli and Barik and Rabbana atina*. Then we end prayer by turning our head to right and then to left while saying "As salamu alaikum wa rahmatullah". May Allah accept your prayers.

Perform the first cycle like the first cycle of 'a three-cycle prayer'.

Perform the second cycle like the second cycle of 'a three cycle prayer'.

Perform it like the first cycle. Recite Al-Fatiha and any other Surah; bow down and then prostrate. And this cycle is completed as well. [According to Maliki School, only chapter al-Fatiha some more verses from the Qur'an are



Perform it like the second cycle of 'a two-cycle Prayer' and complete your prayer. May Allah accept your prayer.


Everything was just as Rebia wanted. It was such a peaceful and spiritual night! Master of the universe was performing ablution in front of him and Rebia was pouring

When our Prophet finished performing his ablution, Rebia gave him a towel and suddenly they caught each other's eyes. Rebia felt embarrassed and bent his head. The Messenger of Allah said:

- I want to be with you in Paradise, O Messenger of Allah!
- Don't you want anything from this world?


- You asked something big from me, can't you ask something else? Rebia said.

The Game Corner Obligations Of Prayer

You remember the obligatory acts of prayer, don't you? Now we will draw a circle to the ground big enough that all of us can fit in it. Either our teacher or one of our friends say one of the obligatory acts of prayer. If he says one of the obligatory acts that must be done during prayer, we will go inside the circle. If he says one of the obligatory acts that must be done before prayer, we will go outside the circle. Of course we will

also do the special movement that represents the obligatory act mentioned. For example; if our teacher says cleaning material impurities (najasa), we will immediately go outside the circle and pretend like we are cleaning our surroundings. If our teac-

> her says ruku, we will immediately go inside the circle and bow down like we are performing ruku during prayer. Those who make a mistake or are late will be out of game. Let us see who will be able to do the acts without any mistake.

OBLIGATORY ACTS OF PRAYER

The obligatory acts that must be done before the performance of prayer:

- 1. Purification from spiritual impurities (hadath); to perform ablution (Students pretend like they are cleaning themselves.)
- 2. Purification from material impurities (najasah); to get cleaned (Students pretend like they are cleaning their surroundings.)
- 3. Satr awrah; to cover certain parts of the body (Students pretend like they are putting something on and covering their body.)
- 4. Turning towards the direction of Mecca (Students stretch out their hands and pretend like they are showing direction.)
- 5. Time; performing the prayer in its established time (Students pretend like they are showing their watches.)


The obligatory acts that must be done during the performance of prayer:

- 1. Intention; to make intention to perform prayer (Students put their hands on their hearts) [According to Hanafi School expressing intention is among the acts that must be done before the prayer]
- 2. Opening takbir; to say Allahu Akbar at the beginning of prayer (Students raise their hands and make the gesture of takbir.)
- 3. Standing (qiyam); to stay standing for a while (Students stay standing.)
- 4. Al-Fatiha: Recitation of chapter al-Fatiha (Make the sign of speech using your hands) [According to Hanafi School, recitation of Fatiha is not an obligatory but a necessary act.]
- 6. Ruku': Bending down (Bend down as if you perform ruku')
- 7. Raising up and Standing straight after ruku' (Stand upright again) [According to Hanafi School, it is not an obligatory but a necessary act]
- 8. Sujud: Performing two prostrations (Prostrate)
- 9. Qa'da: Sitting between two prostrations (Sit for a while)
- 10. Final Sitting: Sitting at the end of the cycles of the prayer. (Sit a little longer)
- 11. Reciting the invocation of Tahiyyat in the final sitting. [According to Hanafi School, it is not an obligatory but a necessary act. According to Maliki School, it is a sunnah]
- 12. Salam: Greeting to the right and left sides (Look aside as if you give salam) [According to Hanafi School, it is not an obligatory but a necessary act.]
- 13. I'tidal: Staying calmly and straight for a while. (Students stay calmly and straight for a while in any act of prayer of their choice)
 [According to Hanafi School, it is not an obligatory but a necessary act.]
- 14. Tuma'nina: Performing prayer calmly and smoothly (Move as if you pray hurriedly and then say "No!" waving your hands) [According to Hanafi School, it is not an obligatory but a necessary act.]
- 15. Tartib: Performing everything in its proper order (Takbir, standing, ruku', sajda, sitting, sajda, sitting and salam. Then everybody clap their hands and each student congratulates one another.)







-My Willpower Gets Strengthened - With My Shield Of Fasting

Fasting is an act of worship which we perform with our body. From dawn (imsak) until sunset, we don't eat and drink anything for the sake of Allah. This act of worship is called as fasting.

No living being can live without eating and drinking. However, we can spend our time without eating and drinking for a while in order to be a good servant of Allah. When we fast, in a way, we say, "O Allah! I am fasting because I love You and to fulfill the command You asked me to do. O Allah! I control myself and do not eat and drink until sunset from all these halal blessings that you have given us. O Allah! Many Thanks to You for all these blessings that You have given us."

When we fast like this.

- **-Our body becomes stronger and can more easily overcome the diseases.

 Fasting even prevents us from catching many types of diseases.
- **-When we control ourselves and do not do everything which come to our mind and do everything we want, we do not become a spoiled or a disobedient person against the commands of Allah. In other words, we can control our desires inside us and strengthen our will power. By this way, we can struggle against difficulties.
- **-We can enter Paradise from a special gate called as "Rayyan." There are awesome gifts awaiting only those who fast. By this way, we live in the hereafter happily forever.

When we perform this act of worship, our eyes, tongues and hearts also fast. Do you know how?

Our eyes fast by not looking at the things that Allah does not want us to look at.

- Our ears fast by not listening to gossips, bad and wrong words.
- **Our tongue fasts by not talking behind anyone, and not saying bad and wrong words.
- **Our heart fasts by controlling the bad feelings such as jealousy and being angry with anyone, and by not feeling heartbroken to anyone.
- **Our organs such as hands, feet and others fast by not hurting anyone and not behaving badly.

By this way, fasting becomes a kind of shield protecting us from badness; a shield which protects from all kinds of badness and wrong actions.

When we properly fast in the month of Ramadan, this shield stays with us in other months as well. It protects us from doing bad actions until the next Ramadan comes. When Ramadan comes again, we strengthen our shield more, and we become a better Muslim than we were before.

our Prophet says us, "Fasting is a shield or a protection from the fire and from committing sins. If one of you is fasting, he should avoid quarrelling. If somebody should fight or quarrel with him, he should say 'I am fasting."

(Bukhari, Sawm, 9; Muslim, Siyam, 163)

Story Of Fasting

It was last days of the month of *Shaban*. The hearts of the Companions in Medina felt the joy and happiness of Ramadan. They performed the prayer in the Mosque and our Prophet said to his Companions gathered around him and listening to him carefully:

-The shadow of a holy and great month came upon us. There is the Night of *Qadr* in this month, which is more valuable than one thousand months. Allah the Exalted obliged us to fast during the days and wanted us to perform prayers during the nights. Whoever makes an effort to get closer to Allah by doing a good deed, he becomes like someone who fulfills an obligatory act of worship in other months. Whoever performs an obligatory act in this month, he is considered as one who performs seventy obligatory acts in other months. Ramadan is a month of patience. The reward of patience is Paradise. This month is sharing others' problems and a month in which believers' provision (*rizq*) is increased.

A poor Companion asked,

-O Messenger of Allah! Not all of us have the means to feed a fasting person. Our Prophet said,

-If you make a Muslim break his fasting even with a date, or a glass of water, or a sip of milk, Allah will offer this person drinking of Paradise from my pond of *Kawthar* on the Judgment Day and such that this person will never feel thirsty until entering Paradise.





Supplications which we say when we are breaking our fasting are very special. Allah certainly accepts the supplications of those who fast, who are just and who are oppressed during. The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) was breaking his fast by saying some supplications all the time.

Would you like to learn his special supplication?

"O Allah, for You I have fasted, in You I have believed, in You I put my trust, and with Your provision I have broken my fast, and I intended to fast the next day of Ramadan, O Allah! Forgive my past and future sins."

Do you know with what our Prophet was breaking his fasting after this supplication?

"When one of you breaks his fast, then let him do so with dried dates, for they are blessed. Whoever does not find dates, then water, for it is purifying." (Tirmidhi, Zakat, 26; Ibn Majah, Siyam, 25; Abu Dawud, Sawm, 21)





Be Careful! Don't Break Our Shield Of Fasting!

Yes, if we do not fast or if we break our fast without a valid excuse, our shield of fasting gets broken. Therefore, in order to protect our shield, we need to learn well which acts break our fasting and which acts do not.

The acts that break our fasting:

- (1) Knowingly eating or drinking something.
- 2 Swallowing the rain drops or snowflakes.
- (3) Knowingly swallowing the remaining food between our teeth from the sahoor meal which we have before starting to fast.
- Breaking fasting mistakenly assuming that it is the time to break fasting (time of iftar)
- 6 Getting vaccinated or having medicine.



Our Prophet gives a small secret to help us to fast easily. Let us see what he says,

"Whoever does four things, fasts easily:

- Breaking fasting with water,
- √ Not neglecting to get up for suhur,
- ✓ Not neglecting to take a rest a little in the afternoon,
- Wearing perfumes. (Ramuz al-Ahadis, Hadith number, 957)



We have two games, are you ready to play?

For our first game, let us read together carefully the words below related to fasting and learn them well.

Suhoor: The time of expressing our intention to fast and the meal we eat before starting to fast. (Pretend like you are eating)

Imsaq: Dawn. (We close our mouth)

Iftar: The Time when sun sets, the time of Evening Prayer starts, and fasting ends. (We put our right hand on our ear and act like we recite *Azan* 'Call to Prayer', and then we act like eating)

Zakah al Fitr: Charity that we give in the month of Ramadan in order to express our gratitude to the blessing Allah has given to us. (We move our hands like we give someone something)

Qada: Make up fasting performed for the days that are not fasted in the month of Ramadan because of being on journey or sick.

Fidya: Giving money enough to feed a needy for one day by a person who cannot fast because of being old, or having illnesses for each day that he could not fast.

The Fast of Kaffarah: Atonement fasting for 60+1 days performed by a person who breaks his fasting intentionally without a valid excuse.

Our teacher or one of friends claps his hands. We will move around until our teacher or friend stops clapping his hands. Our teacher or friend will say something that would either breaks our fasting or not.

If our teacher says something that breaks fasting, students will sit down immediately and say "NO, STOP!" If teacher

says something that does not break fasting, students will continue moving by clapping hands.

The one who makes the wrong movement will be out of the game. The one who stays until the end of the game will be the winner.

First Good News!

Jabir b. Abdullah (May Allah be pleased with him) gives us glad tidings from our Prophet Muhammad (Peace be upon him).

"Five gifts have been given to my *Ummah* in the month of Ramadan that they have not been given to any of the prophets before me:

First: On the first night of Ramadan, Allah looks at my *Ummah* with a glance of mercy. Allah does not punish those whom He looks at with a glance of mercy.

Second: The smell of the mouths of those who fast is more beautiful than the smell of musk in the presence of Allah.

Third: Every day and night, Angels ask from Allah for the forgiveness of those who fast.

Fourth: On that day, Allah commands His paradise as follows, "O Paradise! Get ready and adorned for My servants. Their salvation from the hardships of this world and coming to My presence and bounties in order to get rest have come closer."


Fifth: When the last night of Ramadan comes, Allah forgives all of His fasting servants."

How much our Lord loves us and how much He is Generous to us, is not He?

Second Good News

We can perform this beautiful and helpful act of worship, fasting, not only in the month of Ramadan but also in other months of the year. By this way, we can make our shield bigger and stronger. This is up to us.

Fastsing which we perform in Ramadan month is obligatory. In other words, our Lord asks us to perform it in the Qur'an. By this way, we achieved great shields and started to protect ourselves by means of these shields of fasting. Our Lord in 183rd verse of chapter *al-Bagara*, says,

"O you who have believed, decreed upon you is fasting as it was decreed upon those before you that you may become righteous."

Fasting which protects, strengthens and makes our shield of fasting greater are the ones that are (nafila) supererogatory. Supererogatory fasts are performed in the months of the year other than Ramadan.

Aisha (May Allah be pleased with her) informs us that Our Beloved Prophet was fasting on Mondays and Thursdays. (Tirmidhi, Sawm, 44)

So that's why Our Beloved Prophet was so strong. One of the reasons that made him to overcome difficulties so easily was that he paid attention to his shield of fasting carefully and to strengthen it all the time.

So, let us fast as well and have a great shield of fasting like our Prophet had. It will protect us from all kind of difficulties.



Don't fast on these four days so that you would break your shield of fasting!



Protective Shield that Covers the World: Zakah (Alms)

Our Lord says in 277th verse of chapter al-Baqara:

"Indeed, those who believe and do righteous deeds and establish prayer and give Zakah will have their reward with their Lord, and there will be no fear concerning them, nor they will grieve."

Our Beloved Prophet said,

"Protect your wealth by giving *Zakah*, heal your patients by giving *sadaqa* (charity), and get ready for the hardships by praying." (Munawi, Fayd al-Qadir, III, 464)

Zakah is an act of worship performed by wealth and money. Like all other acts of worships, Zakah and charity provide us many benefits and protect us. When we give Zakah, the gifts given us by Allah increase. They never decrease. We become richer when we give Zakah and charity.

If we give Zakah out of our wealth, we will be protecting our wealth and money. Besides, when we give Zakah and charity, we will meet the needs of

the people around us and help them. If all people give their Za-kah, there will be no poor and hungry people left in the world. All people will have full stomach and have clean clothes. In this way, both those who give and receive Zakah can happily live in the world. How nice...

So when you do all these nice deeds, they are accepted as charity. If you do like this, you will earn the multiple rewards and gifts of Paradise. Do not be sad."



The Chart Of The Shield Of Zakah

Here is the outline of almsgiving (zakat). You can easily raise your shield of zakat by using this outline. In this outline, you can find who gives alms and charity, to whom they are given, and how they are given. Would you like to know how? The child in the middle shows the person to who he needs to give zakat. We understand from the inscriptions that the person who has to pay zakat should be a sane and adult Muslim who owns enough wealth to pay zakat.



People to whom we can give zakah are shown on the world.

What will you give as zakah? It is so easy. Photos near the hands are showing them to us. Animals,

crops (vegetables, fruit...), money, gold, silver and commercial merchandise.

Charity is the act of worship that strengthens and supports the shield of zakah. People who do not have enough wealth to give zakah can raise their "The Supporting Shield of Charity." In this way, they can also have this great shield. To raise the shield of charity, it is enough to be good-humored and

nice person. If you want to strengthen it more, you can donate to institutions of charity, feed the needy, and give *zakat al-fitr* before the Feast of Ramadan. You can also have a school or a water fountain built, write a book or educate students.

In this way, our shield of zakah which will protect us will be raised and we will enjoy all the benefits written on it.

How nice! Take action to earn this shield covering this world!

The last one of our friends will give his charity to the first friend and in




this way, we will create a circle. We will take the shape of the world by giving alms and charity and will reach all people by our bridges.

The Army That Gets Stronger by Alms and Charity

Syrian Christians wrote a letter to Byzantine Emperor Heraclius. They informed him in this letter that Muslims were miserable in famine and poverty. Moreover, they told him that it was the best time to destroy Muslims, and asked him to send an army over Muslims to destroy them.

Upon this request, Heraclius prepared a huge army with 40.000 soldiers and set the army off under the command of Kubad. There even were other armies supporting them.



When our beloved Prophet heard about it, he prayed Allah saying: "O Allah! Do not let these handful Muslims to be destroyed! Otherwise, there will be no believer left on this earth worshipping you..." and then he gathered his Companions and told them that they were going on an expedition over Byzantine in order to ensure the Muslims' safety. He then called everyone to donate money and provisions for the Muslim army.

In those days, the weather was extremely hot and dry. There was a sever famine. The road of expedition was very long, and the enemy army was very strong.

Despite all those difficulties, Muslims competed with each other in helping the Muslim army. Everyone, both rich and poor brought whatever they had and donated to the army. With the alms and charities, Muslim army got stronger. Muslims held onto each other and got united. Heraclius, the Emperor of Byzantine, who saw the magnificent state of Muslims was shocked and got scared to fight with them. He said, "I thought Muslims were weak because of famine and poverty?! Byzantines who wanted to destroy Muslims signed a treaty for the benefit of Muslims. In this way, Muslims got stronger and added more to their gains.



PERFORMING PILGRIMAGE (Hajj)





We perform Pilgrimage and become Pilgrims (Hajji).


We come back from pilgrimage puried from sins

Pilgrimage (Hajj) means to visit the house of Allah, The Holy Ka'bah, and other Holy places in Mecca.

As a religious term, Pilgrimage (Hajj) means to wear the clothes of ihram in the month of Dhu'l-Hijjah, circumambulate around the Ka'bah and wait for a while in the plain of Arafah.

The person who visits these places on certain days of the year (the period of Feast of Sacrifice) becomes a pilgrim according to Islam. The Ka'bah can also be visited on days other than the days of hajj, and can be circumambulated in ihram clothes, and can be waked back and forth between the hills of Safa and Marwa. This is called as *umrah* or minor pilgrimage.

Here is the Map of Journey of Pilgrimage for you




In order to become a pilgrim, we need to fulfill certain conditions. These conditions are;

1 To be someone who is free, adult, and sane.

2 To be someone who has enough time to go to pilgrimage.

To have enough financial means to provide for his family's living

expenses throughout the time he performs his pilgrimage.



To be healthy enough to go to the journey of pilgrimage and perform its required acts.

The safety of the roads that need to be passed during the journey.

Let's see what Our Lord and our beloved Prophet said about pilgrimage:

"And proclaim to the people the Hajj (pilgrimage), they will come to you on foot and on every lean camel; they will come from every distant pass." (Chapter al-Haj, 27)

The Messenger of Allah said: "Alternate between Hajj and Umrah; for those two remove poverty and sins just as the bellows removes filth from iron, gold, and silver - and there is no reward for Al-Hajj Al-Mabrur except for Paradise." (Tirmidhi, Hajj, 2)

Yuppie! How beneficial pilgrimage is. By means of pilgrimage, we are cleaned from spiritual dirt and become clean. And then... We fly to endless Paradise.

Story

Shaqiq Balhi, a friend of Allah, saw a man crawling on the road towards Mecca. It was obvious that he was coming from long distance. He felt sorry for him and asked:

- Where do you come from? The man said:
- From Samarkand. Shaqiq Balhi asked:
- Since when you are on this journey? The poor crippled man replied,
- I am on this journey for more than ten years.

Thinking how this man was able to go on this journey even though he was disabled man, Shaqiq Balhi astonishingly looked at the man's face. The man asked,

- Why are you looking at me like this? Shaqiq Balhi replied:
- Because I am shocked. Because you are disabled, while your path is very long...

The man whose heart is full of desire to see the Ka'bah said,

- O Shaqiq! My way is long, that's right, but my faith in Allah and my love for Allah's Ka'bah help me see this road shorter. As for my disability, my Lord is helping me. O Shaqiq! Are you shocked seeing a man that Allah helps can stand such a long journey? When Allah helps one of His servants, would there be any difficulties for this servant?!



After the Prophet Ibrahim completed the building the Ka'bah, Allah commanded him: "Proclaim people for pilgrimage." And Prophet Ibrahim responded:

- How my voice will reach all people my Lord?

Then Allah said,

- Just invite. We are the one who will make everyone to hear this call. Then the Prophet Ibrahim called out,
- O People! Allah made it obligatory for you to visit the Holy Ka'bah. Every existence between the sky and the earth heard this call, such that many people coming from all corners of the world, even from very away lands to circumambulate the Ka'bah, to perform pilgrimage. (Ibn Hajar, Fath al-Bari, 4/152)

So, all people who follow this call say the supplication of talbiya when they go to pilgrimage. By saying talbiya, they mean, "O our Lord, you invited us and we came to your presence, All Praise is to You, and all blessings come from you."

Talbiya means accepting Allah's invitation and going to His presence.

Abdullah ibn Umar said, "I learned talbiya by hearing from our beloved Prophet who said,

Labbayka Allāhumma Labbayk. Labbayka Lā Sharīka Laka Labbayk. Inna'l hamda, wa'n-ni'mata, Laka wa'l Mulk, Lā Sharīka Lak.

لَبَّيْكَ اللَّهُمَّ لَبَّيْكَ ، لَبَّيْكَ لاَ شَرِيكَ لَكَ لَبَيْكَ ، ﴿ لَبَيْكَ ، ﴿ إِنَّ الْحَمْدَ وَالنِّعْمَةَ لَكَ وَالْمُلْكَ ، لاَ شَرِيكَ لَكَ

'Here I am O Allah, (in response to Your call), here I am. Here I am, You have no partner, here I am. Verily all praise, grace and sovereignty belong to You. You have no partner.' (al-Bukhari, Hajj, 26)

So let's say the supplication of Talbiya all together, and be among those who are invited to pilgrimage.



Pilgrimage

You remember the game of pilgrimage, don't you? Let us add another game to it. Let us learn which acts nullify ihram.

Among the months, Dhu al-Hijjah is the month of pilgrimage. It is obligatory for rich people to go to pilgrima-Let us see what are the pillars of pilgrimage? We make intention, we wear ihram. We go to the Ka'bah, we circumambulate. We go to Arafah, we wait there for a while. We go to Muzdalifa, and we pray there. We stone the Devil in the morning of Festival of Sacrifice. We sacrifice an animal and we get a hair cut. We perform the visiting circumambulation. We perform sa'y or walk between the hills of Marwa and Safa. We become pilgrims, and cleaned from the sins! We become pilgrims, and we become happy!

Below are the acts that we cannot do when we are in ihram:

Hurting others, fighting, swearing at people, saying bad words and behaving in a bad way.

Cutting nails, having a haircut or shaving beard, and plucking or cutting hair from any part of the body.

Oiling hair or moustache, or dyeing hair, or applying gel on hairs or polishing nails and using lipsticks, or putting perfume on our ihram cloth or any part of our body.

Wearing dress, covering head and face; wearing gloves, socks or high heels. Plucking and cutting flowers in Mecca or around it.

- Now, it is time to bring a big white towel from home to cover our body. We cover a friend of us that we chose while reciting supplication of *talbiya*.
- Now, it is time to perform pilgrimage. In order to perform it, we will write down on seven papers the following in order: Circumambulating the Ka'bah, Sa'y between the hills of Safa and Marwa, Arafah, Muzdalifa, Mina, Stoning the Devil, sacrificing an animal having a haircut, Visiting Circumambulation. And then, we will put them on the ground five steps away from each other. If it is possible, we can also write down the above-mentioned words on the ground with chalk.
- Our friend who wants to become a pilgrim will move on this path of course, without doing any act that would nullify our *ihram*.

Meanwhile, we will try to make our friend do some of these acts. For example, we may try to make him angry, by pushing him or doing something that would make him angry. Or we can say, your hair is in mess, comb it with this; or we can give a bottle of perfume to him and say 'You like my perfume so much, why do not you wear it?' or we can give him socks and say 'I bought these socks as a gift for you, why do not you wear it'; or we can say 'this thorn may hurt you, why do not you pick it up?', or 'You may get sunstroke, let me give you a hat' etc.

Of course, you will say some acts that do not nullify our ihram. For example, "Eat an apple or you have dust on your hair, clean it..." etc. Our friend who wears the ihram clothes has to do the acts that do not nullify our *ihram*.

The one who confuses the friend who wears the ihram and makes him do the mistake will take his place. He will wear the ihram clothes while reciting the supplication of *talbiya* and starts the journey for pilgrimage. Those who finish this journey without making any mistakes will be successful.



Story Of The Ka'bah And Zamzam

The Prophet Ibrahim and his wife Hagar had a very beautiful baby named as Ishmael. They were raising him with love. Then one day, Allah commanded the Prophet Ibrahim to leave Hagar and Ishmael in the middle of a desert. In this request, there were secrets hidden that only Allah knows. The Prophet Ibrahim told this command to his wife, Hagar. They got prepared and set off. They made a long journey by passing mountains and hills. Finally, they arrived to a desert where nothing existed except sand. The Prophet Ibrahim looked around and understood that this was the place that Allah informed. He said to Hagar that he has to leave them there and go. Hagar looked around anxiously and told him: "is Allah the One Who asked you to do that, O Ibrahim?" The Prophet Ibrahim responded saying, "Yes, Allah asked me to do this." Just when she heard it, the fear in her face disappeared and she started smiling. "In that case, you can leave us here without any hesitation" The Prophet Ibrahim hugged her and his little baby Ishmael, and smelled them. He left them after telling them that he loved them very much.

The desert was very hot and there was nothing except sand. After a while, the food and water they brought with them run out. Ishmael started to feel hungry so much that he started crying because of hunger. Hagar was sure that Allah was going to help them and would not leave them alone there.



She started to think about what to do. Because her baby started crying so much, Hagar couldn't stay. She started to run between the hills of *Safa* and *Marwa* to see if there was anyone passing or to find something to eat and drink. She was running to *Safa* and then to *Marwa*, and waiting for the help from Allah. At that moment, her baby suddenly stopped crying. Hagar immediately ran to him because of wondering what had happened. Amazingly she saw that water was flowing from the place that her baby hitting his foot. Hagar immediately came to the baby Ishmael and said to the water "*Zam zam, zam zam,* stop, stop, stop, stop!" to stop it flowing and getting waste. She immediately put her hands in front of the water and tried to save it.

So, when we go to pilgrimage, we run between the hills of *Safa* and *Marwa* like Hagar did. We all know that Allah is with us and He helps us all the time. As for *Zamzam?* It has become the name of the fountain which has never stopped flowing from that day on. Since that day, people satisfied their thirsty and felt satisfied. If Hagar had not stopped it, it might have turned into a river. Today, there are wells of zamzam in that place. Millions of Muslims drink zamzam water there and feel relieved. *Zamzam* water has been flowing for thousands of years but never run out. It not only satisfies people's thirst, but also satisfies their hunger.

Later, people who saw the oasis in the middle of the desert came and settled down there. The Prophet Ibrahim also came there and started to live happily with his family. That place first turned into a residential area and then developed into the holy city of Mecca.

Years later, the baby Ishmael grew up and he built the Ka'bah together with his father, the Prophet Ibrahim.

So, this is the story of the Ka'bah and the well of Zamzam... All Muslims are satisfied their thirst and hunger with the zamzam water. They perform pilgrimage with peace and tranquility. They think about those memories and pray Allah. By means of those memories, the secrets and beauties hidden in the Prophet Ibrahim's trial have revealed themselves.

When we perform pilgrimage, our shield of pilgrimage develops. And what does this shield make us gain? They are countless. Let us tell you some of them.


- Muslims who perform pilgrimage express their thanks to Allah for the health, wealth and blessings in this world that He has given to them.



Our Material And Spiritual Cleanliness

إِنَّ اللهَ يُحِبُّ التَّوَّابِينَ وَيُحِبُّ الْمُتَطَهِّرِينَ

It is stated in the Qur'an, "Indeed, Allah loves those who are constantly repentant and loves those who purify themselves." (Surah al-Baqarah, 222)

Hero Muslim is always clean.

Because cleanliness comes from faith.

Our Prophet tells this fact to us as follows "نامي ال ا نم قف اظن ل ا" (Cleanliness is from faith.) (Muslim, Taharah 1; Darimi, Wudu 2; Musnad 5/342; Ajluni, Kashf al-Hafa, 291)

Then, what are the material and spiritual impurities? Material impurity means that our body, clothes, foods and environment get dirty. While spiritual impurity means that our intention, words, and behaviors become evil.



We can get rid of our material dirt by washing it with water and soap. However, we can clean ourselves from spiritual impurities only by beautifying our morality and performing acts of worship. If we continue performing daily prayers and reading the Qur'an and praying with determination and patience, we will be purified from spiritual impurities and will be cleaned. Then, our tongue will start to tell the truth, our behaviors and words become kind, and we will not hurt anyone.

Let us give you a secret. Just like there are stain removers for our clothes, there are also strong stain removers for the spiritual impurities.

Yes, if a person recognizes his mistakes, feels regret, and decides not to do them again, Allah, Who accepts sincere repentance, forgives the sins of that person. A repentant become like a new born baby, pure and sinless.

And the secret of repentance is to say "Astaghfirullah al-azim wa atubu ilayh" and to not get close to that mistake again.

Here is the best stain remover purifying us from nonmaterial dirt.

"Astaghfirullah al-azim wa atubu ilayh"



When We Live as Our Prophet Taught us

In old times, the people in Mecca did not use to brush their teeth and did not use to live in a very clean environment. The old, the young, and children used to dye because of diseases.

And our Prophet who lived in those days paid attention to his cleanliness very much. He would comb his hair and beard, and put a kind of oil with musk, and pay attention to his personal care. When he walked, he would spread good fragrance all around. The people knew that he passed through that path from the nice fragrance they smelled.

Our Beloved Prophet used to carry his *miswaq* (stick toothbrush) in his pocket all the time. He would always clean his teeth with it after he ate something or when he performed ablution. When he smiled, his clean teeth would shine like pearls.

One day our mother A'isha asked to our Prophet, who always went to the presence of his Companions in clean and perfect way:

-'O Messenger of Allah, why are you paying so much attention to your health and personal care?'

Our Prophet smiled brightly and said:

-'Allah loves his servants who do their personal care when they go to meet their friends.'

The Companions of our Prophet, who tried to take him as an example for themselves, started to act like him. One day, when our Prophet was speaking with his Companions he asked,

-Do you want me to inform you about the deeds which remove the sins and strengthen your faith?

The Companions said,

-Yes, O Messenger of Allah.


Our Prophet said, "Performing ablution even when there are hardships,

taking many steps towards the mosque in order to perform prayer, and waiting for the time of next prayer when you are done praying. This is the thing that you should strongly attach yourself."

(Muslim, Taharah 41)

The Companions who heard about it started to be in the state of ablution all the time.

They immediately cleaned the-



ir clothes when any dirt smudged on them. They brushed their teeth with miswaq and their smile became bright. The more the number of Muslims increased, the less bad smells and diseases started to be seen in Mecca.

In his another speech, our Prophet said: "My people would come with bright faces and bright hands and feet on account of the marks of ablution, so he who can increase the luster of his forehead (and that of his hands and legs) should do so." (Muslim. Taharah. 35) Companions who heard this started to perform ablution more and more. Their hands and faces were getting brighter and brighter. Then, they started to wash their hands before eating something, and left the table before feeling completely full when they were eating. They became more hardworking and stronger with the acts of worships they performed and the good deeds they did. Thanks to daily prayer, they achieved an orderly life and became healthier and happier.

They were no longer getting sick as they had in the past. The doctors started not being able to find any patients to examine. Mecca became a bright city that everyone started to admire our Prophet and Muslims who followed his footsteps.

The Best Cleanser of Our Body and Soul: ABLUTION (WUDU')

A Hero Muslim pay attention to his personal care very much. He performs ablution every day by washing his hands, face, feet; and washes whole body a few times a week and never smells sweat.

Now it is time for us to learn how to perform ablution.

1. Prayer Ablution

Our Prophet gives us good tidings. "When a Muslim or a believer-washes his face (in course of ablution), every sin he contemplated with his eyes will be washed away from his face along with water, or with the last drop of water; when he washes his hands, every sin they wrought will be effaced from his hands with the water, or with the last drop of water; and when he washes his feet, every sin towards which his feet have walked will be washed away with the water or with the last drop of water with the result that he comes out pure from all sins." (Muslim, Taharah, 32)

As our material body is cleansed by means of performing ablution, our feelings and intentions, which are our spiritual side, are also purified. How nice... So, let us learn how to perform ablution as soon as possible!

We wash all our all limbs by rubbing them well without giving a break in between them.

Ablution is a light, and we shine when we perform ablution. The more we perform ablution, the brighter we become. Our skin becomes beautiful and our eyes start to spread energy of happiness.

2. Major Ablution (Ghusl)

There is also Major Ablution the we perform in addition to our daily minor ablution. With major ablution, our body is cleaned and it smells nicely. Our protecting shield becomes shiny.

Below is how to perform major ablution (ghusl):

- Tirstly, we recite basmala, and make our intention to perform major ablution.
- To We thoroughly wash our hands up to our wrists three times, and clean our hands if there is anything impure on our hands and nails.

- To We wash our private parts and thighs.
- Then we draw water to our mouth three times by our right hand. If we are fasting, we should be very careful not to swallow any water.
- To We rinse and clean our mouth.
- 🏷 Then we draw water in our nostrils by our right hand three times.
- The then blow the water by using our left hand. In this way, we thoroughly clean our nostrils. After that, we perform minor ablution just like we perform before prayer. After performing minor ablution, we pour water over our head three times.
- The We then pour water over our right shoulder three times and then over our left shoulder three times and wash our body by rubbing it.
- Then, we wash our body completely by rubbing without leaving any dry place. We should be very careful not to forget especially some parts of our body such as belly button, inner parts of our ears, ear hole, the roots of our hair and the roots of our beard.
- This way, we cleanse our body from all kinds of impurities. We become pure and clean.

How nice.

3. Dry Ablution (Tayammum)

Sometimes there are times of drought in our lands. We may not be able to find water for days or sometimes we may not be able to find water when we are in long journeys. When we do not have water, are we going to stay in a spiritually impure state? Of course not. Soil is a clean material. If we perform dry ablution (tayammum) when there is no water, we will be purified from material and spiritual impurities and will be clean. So, are you ready to perform dry ablution (Tayammum)?

- We recite Basmala (in the name of Allah) when we start performing dry ablution (tayammum) and then express our intention..
- We rub our palms on clean soil.
- We strike our hands to each other in order to shake of the excess dust on our hands.
- 9 We thoroughly rub our entire face.
- Then, we rub our palms on the soil again.
- We strike our hands to each other in order to shake of the excess dust on our hands.
- We rub our right arm with our left hand up to the elbows (including elbows). After that, first we rub our left arm up to the elbow (including elbow) with our right hand.





We perform ablution to get cleansed. However, in which situations does our ablution become invalid and does it become necessary to perform ablution again? Let's learn!

- Impurities such as blood, urine, and feces coming out of our front and back private parts: Defecation and urination.
 Going to the bathroom
- When blood or pus comes out of our body

Bleeding

- When we vomit more than the amount that fills our mouth

But how spiritual impurities are cleansed? Here is the answer; Repenting (Istighfar)

Repenting is a kind of stain remover cleansing all kinds of spiritual impurities. It cleans our mistakes and errors without leaving any trace behind.

Now we will play its game.

We will choose a friend as a referee, and s/he will try to deceive us by telling us acts and behaviors which nullify our ablution or make us spiritually impure. We will pretend like performing ablution in the situations that require to be cleaned by performing ablution. We will bow our head down and say "Astaghfirullah al-Azim" in the situations that we have to be cleaned with repenting.

Here are the words showing us both situations! Good luck!

A hero Muslim is an exemplary person that all people admire because of his/her cleanliness.

Keeps Himself / Herself away from the Forbidden (Haram)

A hero Muslim never eat forbidden foods. He/she stays away from forbidden products and foods such as alcohol, drugs and pork products as if he/she runs away from them. He/she never eat food or use the things that are stolen or in injustice way. In this way, s/he protects her/his body and heart from badness and ugly feelings.

Protects his/her tongue from the Impurities of Bad Words

S/he does not tell words including swearing, insulting and shameful words. S/he does not search for the mistakes and faults of others and reveal them. In this way, everyone enjoys speaking with a hero Muslim. Nobody feels disturbed from him/her. Everyone wants to be a friend with him/her.

Stays away from Useless Knowledge and Time Wasting Occupations

S/he does not make his mind busy with useless knowledge and never numb his mind with computer games, television programs for hours. He avoids gossip, backbiting, and useless speeches. He avoids commenting about people carelessly and never makes his mind and tongue dirty.

S/He does not violate Other People's Rights

S/he does not gossip and backbite, and never makes jokes which may hurt others' hearts. S/He never makes fun of others behind by making face expressions. S/he never makes others sad by giving bad nicknames to them. S/he never takes anyone's stuff without permission. By this way, they hesitate to violate rights of others.

S/he keeps his/her environment clean







Those are the companions of Paradise, abiding eternally therein as reward for what they used to do." Our Lord invites us to live righteously and honestly and draws our attention to one of the greatest features that a real hero must have.

As for our best example, i.e. our Prophet, he leads us to the right path and guides us. Our Prophet always spoke the truth. He never lied even when telling a joke. He would care other people's stuff entrusted to him. When anyone gave him something in order to be protected, they were sure that they would take their stuff back just as it was, and on time. People who entrusted their secrets to him were sure that they would never hear their secrets from other people.

People called our prophet as "al-Amin" because of his truthful and honest behaviors. This title means someone who is trustworthy and is trusted that he does not do bad things.

So, we should also be righteous and honest in order to be like him, i.e. someone trustworthy. Do you know how? Our Lord gives us information to make us truthful and honest and He revealed verses to us. Here are the verses of righteousness and honesty.

"O you who have believed, why do you say what you do not do? Great is hatred in the sight of Allah that you say what you do not do." (Chapter al-Saf, 2nd and 3rd verses)

"But whoever earns an offense or a sin and then blames it on an innocent (person) has taken upon himself a slander and manifest sin." (Chapter al-Nisa, 112)



"And they who are to their trusts and their promises attentive."

(Chapter al-Mu'minun, 8th verse)

"O you who have believed, if there comes to you a disobedient one with information, investigate, lest you harm a people out of ignorance and become, over what you have done, regretful." (Chapter al-Hujurat, 6)

"O you who have believed, be persistently standing firm in justice, witnesses for Allah, even if it be against yourselves or parents and relatives. Whether one is rich or poor, Allah is more worthy of both. So follow not [personal] inclination, lest you not be just. And if you distort [your testimony] or refuse [to give it], then indeed Allah is ever, with what you do, Acquainted."

(Chapter al-Nisa, 135)

An Example Incident for the Honesty of Our Prophet Muhammad (pbuh)



Our Lord says in the Qur'an, "Indeed, we offered the Trust to the heavens and the earth and the mountains, and they declined to bear it and feared it; but man (undertook to) bear it..." (Chapter al-Ahzab, 72)

Yes, we, humans, have free will. We can think and distinguish the correct from the wrong. We can take our decisions ourselves, in other words, we can make self-control, and control ourselves about doing the good and keeping ourselves from the bad. That is why we, humans, have accepted the trust of faith instead of mountains, stones, animals and plants. We are able to fulfill our responsibilities because we can distinguish the right and the wrong, the good and the bad, the beautiful and the ugly.

In order to be more successful, we should do our tasks on time in order to undertake our trust and fulfill our responsibilities. Here is a Memory from our Prophet about Responsibility

One day our beloved Prophet and his friends were travelling on camels. Our Prophet was going from behind. His Companion Muadh Ibn Jabal said,

- O Messenger of Allah! Do you mind if I come close to you? And then he came closer to him. When our Prophet permitted him, Muadh asked,
- Let my life be sacrificed for you O Messenger of Allah! My wish from Allah is to take our lives before you. However, if you die before us, which acts of worship should we perform after you?

Our Prophet remained silent for a while before answering this question. Upon this, Muadh asked:

- Should we fight for the sake of Allah? Our Prophet said,
- Jihad for the sake of Allah is good, but there is something better than this for you.
 - Do you mean fasting and almsgiving?
- Fasting and almsgiving are good as well, but there is something better than this for people.

Muadh (May Allah be pleased with him) said all kind of goodness he know and responsibilities he performs but each time, our Prophet told him that there was something better.

Muadh couldn't stand more and asked,

- Let my mother and father be sacrificed for you O Messenger of Allah! What is better than these things?

Then our Prophet showed his tongue and said:

- Stay silent when you will not speak good. Muadh asked:
- Will we be judged for what we speak as well?

Then, our Prophet touched Muadh's knees and said:

- May Allah give you the best, O Muadh! What else can lead a person to

Hell facedown except his tongue? Whoever believes in Allah and the Day of Judgment either should speak good or keep silent! You should be winner by speaking the good word, and reach the comfort and peace by not speaking harmful words.

Muadh listened our beloved Prophet's advice carefully and thought for a long time. Why should he speak if his words were not going to help him anyway, even will cause badness? He would successfully fulfill this resolution. He said "I can do it!" to himself. He thought "This is my responsibility. I can stay silent not to hurt people and not to be misunderstood. I can stay SILENT even if I am angry, excited or happy if the words I am going to say may hurt others."

Allah makes nights to us like a blanket, and the stars and the Moon like night lamps not to get afraid from darkness.

Our Lord loves us so much that He created everything for us. For example, trees produce oxygen for us, and flowers smell wonderful.

Examples of Love and Respect from our Beloved Prophet

Each person is respectable, and deserves to be respected. The person who shows respect to others has good morals, and is a mature person. Everyone shows respect to him. One day, when our Prophet was speaking with his Companions in Medina, a Jewish funeral procession passed in front of them. Our Prophet stood up immediately and waited until they passed. Our Prophet's Companions were surprised and asked, "O Messenger of Allah, this is a Jewish funeral. He is not a Muslim, why did you stand up?" Our Prophet responded: "He is not a Muslim, but he is a human being." With this answer, our Prophet's Companions understood the importance of showing respect to every person they were living with. They treated everyone with respect no matter from which religion they were or what kind of thoughts they had. Because of their respectful treatment, they were respected and appreciated all the time.

Our Prophet Loved and Respected the Kids. When a kid held the Prophet's hand, he would not leave the kid's hand until the kid would. He would carefully listen to the kid or an adult until the end of their speech. He would give the gifts came to him to the youngest person around him and make them happy. When his daughter Fatima entered his room, he would stand up and welcome her with love, respect and smiling face. He would carry his grandsons Hasan and Husain on his back, and play the game of camel with them. (Bukhari, Adab, 18)

Once when he was praying, his granddaughter Umamah hugged the Prophet's shoulder and climbed up on his back. She was trying to play with him by this way while the Prophet was performing prayer. Every time our Prophet wanted to bow down, he carefully put her down, and when he stood up, he lifted her up. He continued his prayer in this way not to disturb her game. Just to make Umamah happy and not to make her sad.

Our beloved Prophet would shorten the prayers which were normally

performed longer such as Dawn and Night Prayer, if there was a child crying among the congregation. He stated his mercy and compassion by saying that "Whoever makes a kid happy until s/he stops crying and treats him/her nicely, Allah will reward him in Paradise with blessings as much as he wants." And our Prophet would love kids by calling them as "the Flowers of Paradise".

Our Prophet loved and respected animals very much as well. One day a camel came close to our Prophet and approached to our Prophet so much that it was as if trying to tell something to our Prophet. It was like murmuring to our Prophet's ear. Our Prophet suddenly asked, "Is there anyone knowing the owner of this camel?" and said, "Tell him to come to me." They found the owner of the camel and brought him to our Prophet. The man felt very happy when he saw our Prophet and did not know what to do because of his excitement. When our Prophet asked, "Is this camel yours?" The man answered excitedly, "Yes, O Messenger of Allah!" Then our Prophet said:

- This camel is complaining about his owner, and says that his owners makes him to carry very heavy loads, and does not feed enough and leaves it hungry.


Then, he told his Companions that these animals were the gifts of Allah and should be cared and treated with love.

You can play this game with the verses of characters either separated from each other or mixed all together. Let us then write the verses down on the small papers.

Then let us prepare a big box containing toys, books, or stationery.

Let us be separated into two groups. Half of each group will stand next to the box, and other half of them will stay 10-15 steps away from them in a single line.

Let us choose a referee. This person will choose the papers on which verses and hadith are written and will throw them in the box while saying "Verses, good and true words are raining from the sky!" He will be careful not to drop them to the ground.

A member of each group will take one of the papers thrown by the referee and will run to his friends standing 10-15 steps away. They will take the paper and write the verse or hadith down on the board. Later on, each group will read the verses and hadith they wrote down on the board.

The group which writes more verses and hadith and finishes the writing first will be the winner.
