
#### THE BRAVE RABBIT

One day the crabs were playing among themselves. They must have made so much noise that their voices reached the ears of the octopus. How could the octopus who had



He never left his home again.




## THE LONELY GAZELLE

He was about to give up hope and accept his fate when he saw a bear passing by at that moment.


- "Hey brother bear! Please help me. I have a big thorn in my foot, I can't move," he called out. Hearing the rabbit's call, the bear said:

The baby duck, who listened to his parents with all ears, promised not to break his word ever again.






# THE OMINOUS LADYBUG

There lived a cute ladybug in this country. This ladybug would travel freely and land on people. People would be very happy to see the ladybug landing on them.


One day, the ladybug went out sightseeing in her neighborhood. He flew as far as his tiny wings took

Ladybug was also very pleased with this situation. And he was careful not to draw too much attention to himself when landing on people again because they may interpret it wrongly.






## THE GIRAFFE AND THE ELEPHANT




had even proved many times to the wolf that he was not a selfish person. That was because he had to gain the wolf's trust. He needed this trust for the future.



The tiger gaspingly said:


- "My king! Strange things are happening in the forest. The animals are restless. Come and have a look", informing the lion of a strange situation in the forest.

The lion king started to follow the crow relying on the crow's word not knowing whether or not it was true.



He finally asked:


- "What happened to you, my king? Why are you moaning?"
